DRIVING TIPS

- In Australia and New Zealand drive on the left hand side of the road and overtake in the right lane. Vehicles are right hand drive
- Seatbelts must be worn at all times by both drivers and passengers in Australia and New Zealand
- Travellers must drive within the speed limit
- In Tasmania and New Zealand while driving distances are short, the winding roads can mean travel times are longer than anticipated
- In the Australian Outback cattle and roaming wildlife often congregate alongside highways. Take particular care when driving at dawn and dusk and avoid driving at night
- In remote parts of Australia driving slowly on gravel roads is recommended
- A unique feature of travelling in Australia are road trains, these can be up to 50 metres in length, so extra care should be taken when overtaking them
- It's illegal to use a mobile phone while driving in Australia and New Zealand. If you need to make a call or send a text, pull over at a rest area or in a safe place



MINIMUM AGE AND LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

The minimum age for drivers of vehicle groups B, C and D is 21 years. Drivers aged 21 to 24 years inclusive are required to pay a AUD27.50 per day surcharge, which is payable directly to Avis at the time of rental. For all other vehicle groups, the minimum age for drivers is 25 years.

Drivers must hold an open licence and have held that licence for at least 12 months. All foreign licenses must be in English. If the foreign license is in a language other than English, it must be accompanied by an International Drivers Permit (containing an English translation).

VEHICLE TYPES

Vehicles in particular groups are subject to availability and may vary by location. A similar vehicle to those pictured may be substituted. Not all vehicle types are available at all locations.

All vehicles include: air-conditioning, ABS, dual airbags and CD/MP3.

SECURITY DEPOSIT

A credit card imprint is required when you take delivery of your vehicle to cover any additional costs such as petrol, child seats and a \$100 fuel bond. Avis accepts all major credit cards. The amount of the deposit is not debited to the card at rental collection; an authority only is taken until the conclusion of the rental when any applicable charges will be debited.







Travel through Eden and explore the Ben Boyd National Park and Eden Whaling Museum. Pass Cann River and Orbost, situated on the banks of the Snowy River, before travelling on to Lakes Entrance.

This is a unique area with rivers, lakes and lagoons joining 90 Mile Beach. Explore the nearby villages of Metung.

Day 4: Lakes Entrance to Phillip Island (315km)

Travel south to Sale, a supply and residential centre for the Bass Strait oil fields and through the lush pastoral hills of Gippsland. From Wonthaggi enjoy coastal scenery all the way to Phillip Island, home to Australia's famous Little penguins. The 'Penguin Parade' occurs each evening at sunset and should not be missed (own expense).

Day 5: Phillip Island to Melbourne (140km)

Take the short journey into the city of Melbourne. The car is booked until the following day and should be dropped off at the city or airport by the same time as it was picked up on day 1 to avoid any additional charges.

For Huon Valley seasonal produce - trout, salmon, oysters, beef, lamb, fruits and vegetables - in a picture postcard rural setting, visit Home Hill Winery Restaurant at Ranelagh, or catch and barbecue your own fish at the Snowy Range Trout Fishery.

Drive to Huonville, for a thrilling jetboat ride on the Huon River (own expense) or continue on to Geeveston for a magical treetop experience at the Tahune Forest AirWalk (own expense). Thrill seekers can try the eagle gliding experience above a 70 metre high forest and the Huon River (own expense). Drive to the fishing town of Dover.

Day 2: Dover and Surrounds

Buy a fresh crayfish from Stanley wharf and have a picnic at one of the deserted beaches, then visit Providore 24 to take home some Tasmanian gourmet produce. Dine at the acclaimed Old Cable Station, or for a casual dining option try the bistro at the Stanley Hotel; this is a food lovers dream!

Day 4: Stanley to Devonport (126km)

Make your way back towards Devonport and stop off at Boat Harbour, a scenic seaside holiday spot surrounded by beautiful farmland. Take a stroll along Boat Harbour Beach and enjoy lunch at a local café.

Travel along to Burnie, a port city with an industrial past. Sample some cheese at Lactos Cheese Factory, then head south to enjoy renowned whiskey at Hellyers Road Whiskey Distillery, before spending the night in

Day 5: Devonport to Launceston (100km)

Driving south, pick up some handmade chocolates from House of Anvers, located just outside Latrobe. Continue on to Elizabeth Town, stopping for a bite at Christmas Hills Raspberry Farm and artisan cheese at Ashgrove

On your way back to Launceston, stop in at the Tasmanian Gourmet Sauce Company at Evandale for some treats to take home.





North Western Tasmania is full of surprises with its dramatic peaks and sparkling lakes of Cradle Mountain-Lake St Clair National Park. Pass through the wilderness to the harbourside town of Strahan and inland to Queenstown with its mining heritage.

Day 1: Launceston

After collecting your vehicle the time is yours to explore Launceston, Tasmania's second largest city nestled in the hilly country where the Tamar, North Esk and South Esk rivers meet. There are galleries to explore, you can take a tour of the James Boag's Brewery or discover the many Tamar Valley wineries. Only 10 minutes from the city centre is the magnificent Cataract Gorge, here almost vertical cliffs line the banks of the South Esk River as it enters the Tamar.

Day 2: Launceston to Cradle Mountain (153km)

Depart Launceston this morning and drive to Deloraine and then on through Railton and Sheffield, which sits in the foothills of Mount Roland, in one of the most scenically attractive areas on the island. From here,

travel straight on to Cradle Mountain Lodge in the Cradle Mountain-Lake St Clair National Park.

Day 3: Cradle Mountain

Today is at leisure to explore Cradle Mountain situated in St Clair National Park with its forests and abundance of wildlife. Cradle Mountain covers some of Tasmania's highest country. The scenery on this part of the drive is quite spectacular passing through the Franklin-Gordon Wild Rivers National Park. Continue south from Tarraleah to New Norfolk and onto Hobart.

Day 1: Adelaide to Wilpena Pound (454km) Collect your vehicle and head north through Port Pirie to Port Augusta and visit the Wadlata Outback Centre. Continue to Wilpena Pound, the centre of the Flinders' Outback. Discover towering rock walls, gorges and Aborioinal rock art.

Day 2: Wilpena Pound This morning enjoy a scenic flight over Wilpena Pound, marvel at the stunning scenery and discover the history of this natural wonder. In the afternoon a half day 4WD tour will give another perspective of this amazing landscape.

Day 3: Wilpena Pound to Port Augusta (162km) Back track south to Port Augusta where you can stock up on any necessities, this is the last major town until you reach Alice Springs.
